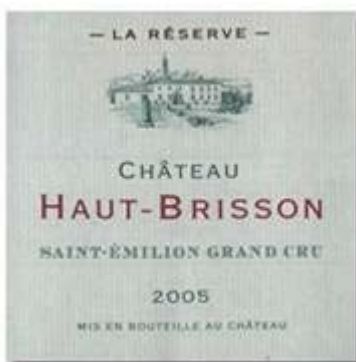

Haut Brisson La Reserve 2005, Pomerol (RP 92)

The top cuvee – a selection of the production from **top-performing parcels** of the vintage, generally from the **oldest Merlot vines** in Huck, Monbousquet and Gessan. The first year of production was 2005.

This wine has an **explosive perfume** and is full-bodied and **intense in its youth**, teaming with ripe, juicy blackberries, plums and vanilla. Coming from vines grown on gravelly soils, the grapes add extra complexity to the character of the wine. After 5-7 years the wine begins to soften and takes on a more savoury tone with caramel, chocolate and dark roast coffee beans. La Réserve can gracefully age 15-20 years.

Grape Varietals: 96% Merlot, 4% Cabernet Franc

Vine Age: 40 years on average

Cultivation: Agriculture Biologique (organic), hand-harvested

Ageing: Minimum 18 months in 100% new French oak

Alcohol Content: 13.5%

Bottling: At the château with neither fining nor filtration

Production: 9,000 bottles per vintage

Robert Parker 92 pts: “A brilliant sleeper of the vintage, this is a terrific effort from Haut-Brisson’s new proprietor. The deep purple-colored 2005 La Reserve exhibits sweet black currant and cherry fruit intermixed with notes of cigar smoke, fruitcake, and cedar. Full-bodied with superb purity, good acidity, and ripe tannin, it should unfold gracefully over the next 5-6 years, and keep for 15+.”

Domaine de L'Eglise 2005, Pomerol (RP 92)

It is in 1589 that the name is mentioned for the first time in the “Vieux Papiers du Libournais”, which makes Domaine de l’Eglise the **oldest estate on Pomerols famous plateau**. Originally property of the church, it was a hospice for people with a disease that were thus kept out of the city of Libourne. The estate was secularised in the 18th century. Domaine de l’Eglise, as the name is indicating, lies next to Pomerols church, **close to Château Petrus**. The round, smooth and fruity Domaine de l’Eglise has been **among the most popular ones from Pomerol** for many years.

Grape Varietals: 95% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc

Vine Age: 40 years on average

Cultivation Density: 7,200 vines per hectare

Terroir: Mostly gravel and sand with clay

Vinification: Vinified in four, short, 100 hectoliter, temperature controlled, stainless vats and aged in 40% new, French oak barrels for between 16 and 18 months

Production: 2,500 bottles per vintage

Robert Parker 92 pts: “Perhaps the finest offering yet from Philippe Casteja’s small Domaine de l’Eglise, the Merlot-dominated, deep purple-hued 2005 exhibits plum, anise, mocha, and chocolate notes. Full-bodied and plush, with decent acidity, high but sweet tannin, and a touch of smoky oak, this full-throttle Pomerol can be drunk over the next 20+ years.”

Grand Puy Lacoste 2005, Pauillac (RP 95)

The history of Grand-Puy-Lacoste is fascinating in many ways. It is a family saga going back to the 16th century. The name Grand-Puy, already mentioned in documents from the Middle Ages, comes from the ancient term "puy" which means "hillock, small height". True to its name, the vineyard sits on outcrops with a terroir similar to that of the Médoc's first growths. From Since the 16th century the property remained attached to a single family from generation to generation, in a direct line through marriage until 1920, before connecting with another family in 1978—the Borie.

Grape Varietals: 78% Cabernet Sauvignon, 22% Merlot

Vine Age: 38 years on average

Terroir: Very deep coarse grave

Cultivation Density: 1,000 vines per hectare

Vinification: A long period of maceration (about 3 weeks), In French oak barrels (70% new barrels each vintage) for between 16 to 18 months depending on the vintage

Robert Parker 95 pts: "The brilliant 2005 Grand-Puy-Lacoste exhibits classic Pauillac aromas and flavors of creme de cassis along with stony/floral notes. Proprietor Xavier Borie has created a wine that should rival the brilliant 1982, 1990, 1996, and 2000. Full-bodied with sweet tannin and superb length (a 40+ second finish), the purity of this beauty's black currant fruit is something to behold. Anticipated maturity: 2013-2030."
